Last week, I attended a Sunday evening service of Advent Lessons & Carols at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, K Street in Washington, D.C. and sat with the Dean of the Philadelphia Chapter, AGO. Dean David Beatty is an engineer by profession and a substitute organist by avocation. He relayed to me that some churches in the Philadelphia area are financially struggling and indicated that several church music positions have either been reduced in size and salary or have been eliminated permanently. David lives outside of Baltimore and has not received any substitute playing jobs because of a surplus of substitute organists. Also, many musicians are not taking vacation during this difficult economic period.

As I wrote last year at this time, "It is imperative that we keep the importance of church music and organ playing in the forefront of our churches." The power of music to transcend beyond the spoken word is elemental to our worship "survival". Why then was the Sunday evening worship service filled to overflowing capacity? Answer: The artistic level of St. Paul's K Street worship and music program is of the highest caliber and people gravitate towards Excellence. That's why! Why then were all the people myself included were singing at full voice to the Glory of God? Answer; Give all you've got to God!

Every January, the York Chapter is represented at the January Jumpstart sponsored by the Philadelphia Chapter. Every year, I ask why more of our members do not attend this wonderful day of learning. You are never too old to learn some new tricks! Why not attend next month's January Jumpstart and plan to receive a free daylong offering of various music topics relevant to all church musicians. Guest workshop presenters included composer Charles Callahan, Handbell and Choral Music William Payn, plus many more. Much is to be gained and the lunch is always very delicious. 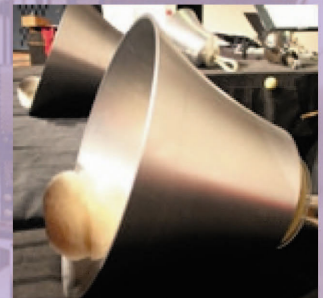

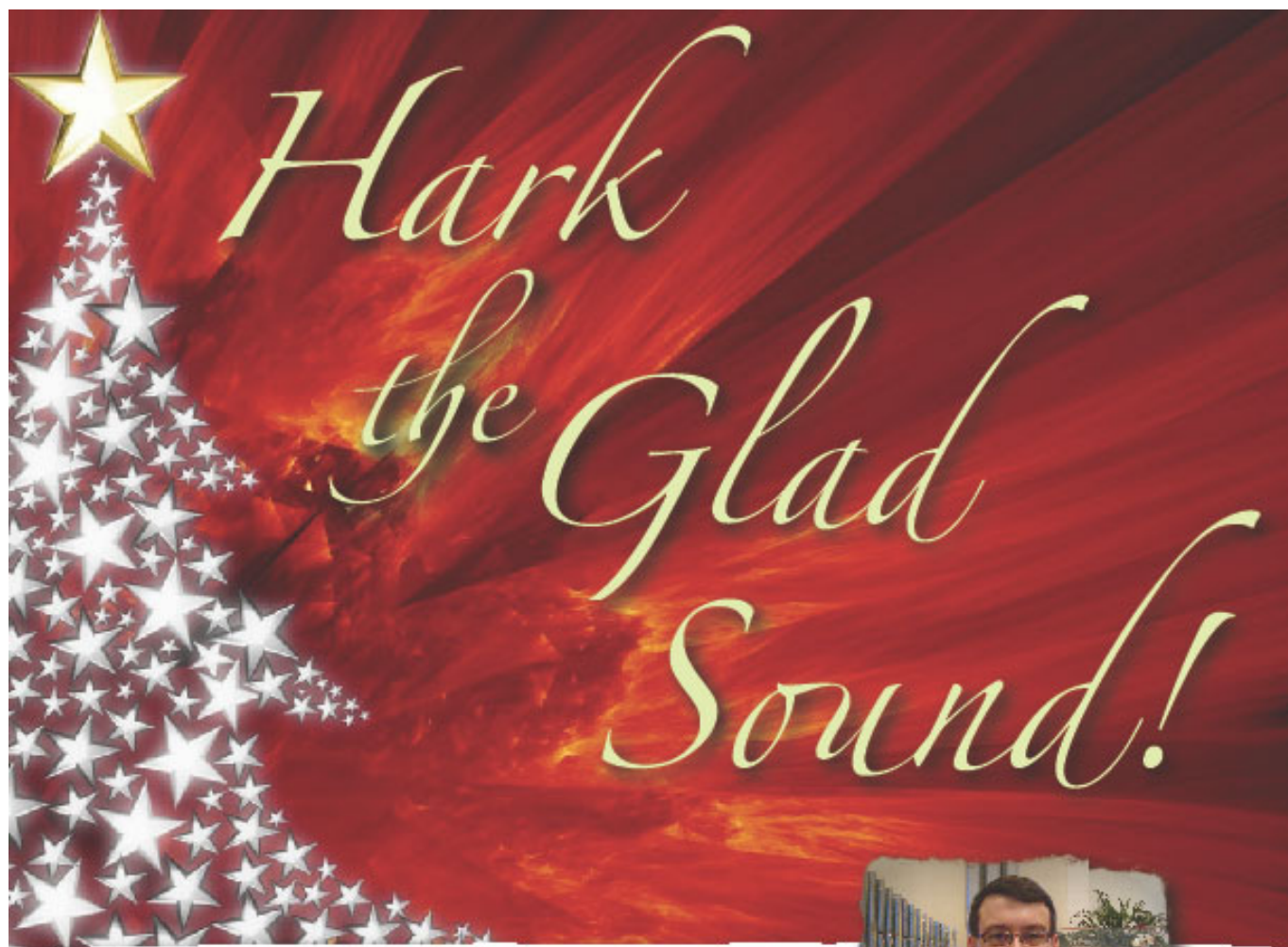

**Charles Callahan** is one of America's leading organist-composers. A native of Cambridge, Massachusetts, he is a graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music and the Catholic University of America. Orchestras, choirs, chamber music ensembles and soloists all over the world have performed compositions by Dr. Callahan. He is a noted educator and author; his books include *The Art of Hymn Playing* and two books on American organ building which have become standard reference works. His most recent compact disc, "Cathedral Echoes" was recorded in the Cathedral-Basilica in St. Louis, Missouri. He is a longtime resident of Middlebury, Vermont where he serves as organist of St Stephen's Church.

## **ORGANLIVE** MAKES IT EASY TO EXPERIENCE THE MUSIC OF THE ORGAN

Organlive.com is an Internet audio station dedicated to the music of the classical organ. Broadcasting since 2003, Organlive has become the most-heard organ station on the Internet. The broadcast is completely free to anyone with a broadband Internet connection and is now easier than ever to tune in. Listeners simply need one click at [www.organlive.com](http://www.organlive.com) to hear the broadcast through Windows Media Player, WinAmp, iTunes, Quicktime, RealPlayer, or any streaming MP3 player.

Additionally the stream may be heard on most mobile devices such as the iPhone or Android based phones. The station is also listed in the classical radio stations on iTunes.

A new website makes it easier to search the ever-growing library of organ music, which currently holds over 10,000 tracks from more than 850 albums of music recorded by organists all over the world. Listeners can log in to rate tracks and albums as well as leave comments on the same.

Organlive plays albums recorded on pipe, digital, and combination organs played by the world's best concert organists, as well as tracks recorded and submitted by less renowned organists. Included are pairings of organ and orchestra, solo instruments, choir, or vocal solos. The listener is presented with the work title, composer, album title, a link to purchase the album or MP3 online, the organ, its builder, size, and location, and a link to the specification of the organ being heard, and often a link to public domain copy of the sheet music of the work.

Listeners may browse the entire library searching by work, composer, organist, album, or organ and request tracks to be played.
