### **Congratulations!**

The AGO celebrates with its distinguished member, **PAUL JACOBS**, winner of the 2011 GRAMMY® Award for Best Instrumental Soloist Performance (without Orchestra). The award was announced at the 53rd Annual GRAMMY Awards in Los Angeles on Sunday, February 13, and given in recognition of his CD recording of Olivier Messiaen's *Livre du Saint-Sacrement* (Naxos, 2010) made at the Church of St. Mary the Virgin in New York City. Jacobs's recording of contemporary classical organ music shared the spotlight with such notable sensations as Lady Gaga, who won three GRAMMYs, herself, in the popular music genre. Paul Jacobs was unable to walk the red carpet to receive the award in person because he was performing with the Phoenix Symphony Orchestra that week.

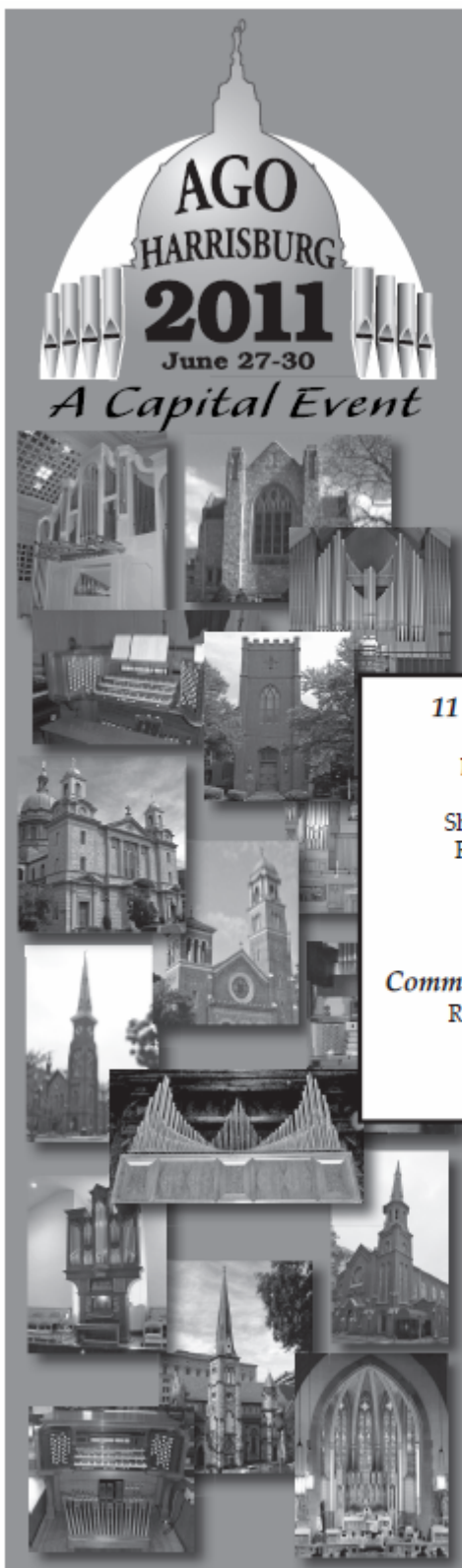
