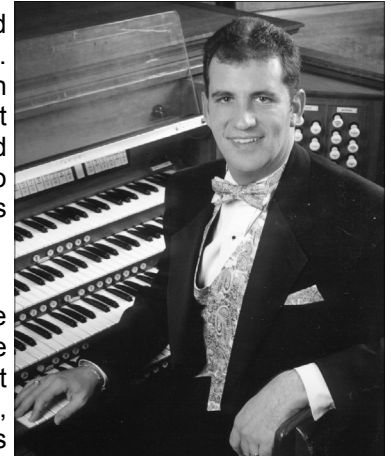

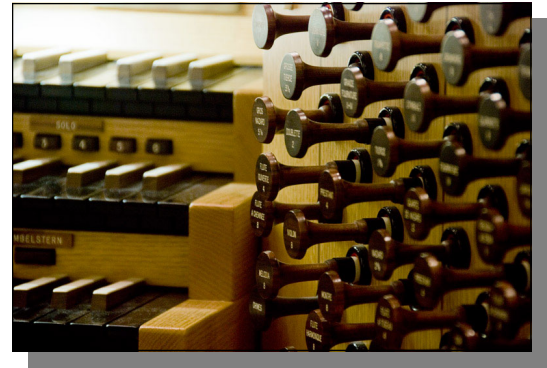

## FORMER YORKER RETURNS FOR ANNIVERSARY

On Sunday, September 20th at 9:30 AM, the congregation of Union Lutheran Church, 408 W. Market St. York, will celebrate its 150th Anniversary with a service commemorating the 40th Anniversary of its 60 Rank, 4-manual, Moller Pipe Organ. Former choir director/organist, Edwin Starner, of Boston, MA, who served the church from 1963 -1970, will serve as guest organist and direct an augmented anniversary choir.

Mr. Starner, a Westminster Choir College graduate, recently retired as organist from The First Church of Christ, Scientist (The Mother Church) in Boston, MA. Having served in several churches on the East Coast, he taught piano and organ at Westminster, later working as Director of Continuing Education for Westminster Choir College of Rider University, Princeton, NJ.

Starner helped to design the organ at Union Lutheran in 1969, and later became a sales representative for the Moller Organ Co. in Hagerstown, MD. The community is invited to attend the anniversary service and greet Mr. Starner at the Coffee Hour afterward.

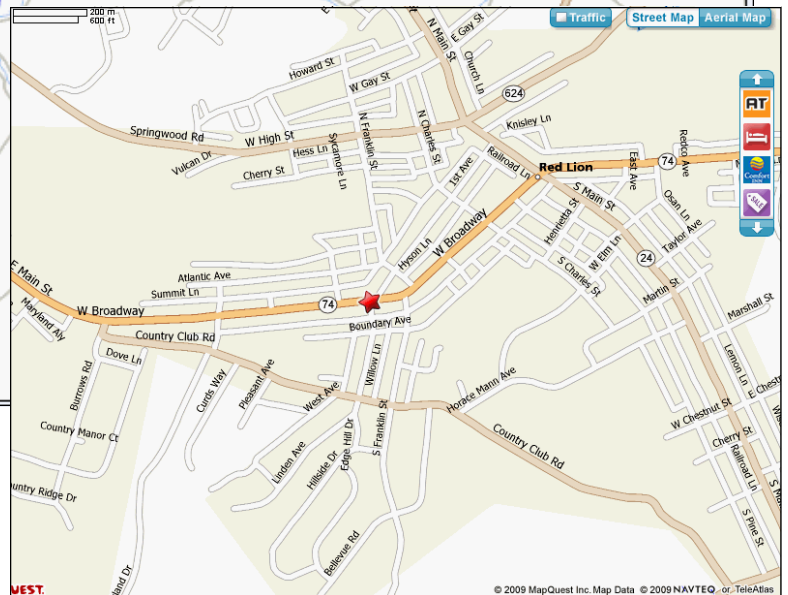
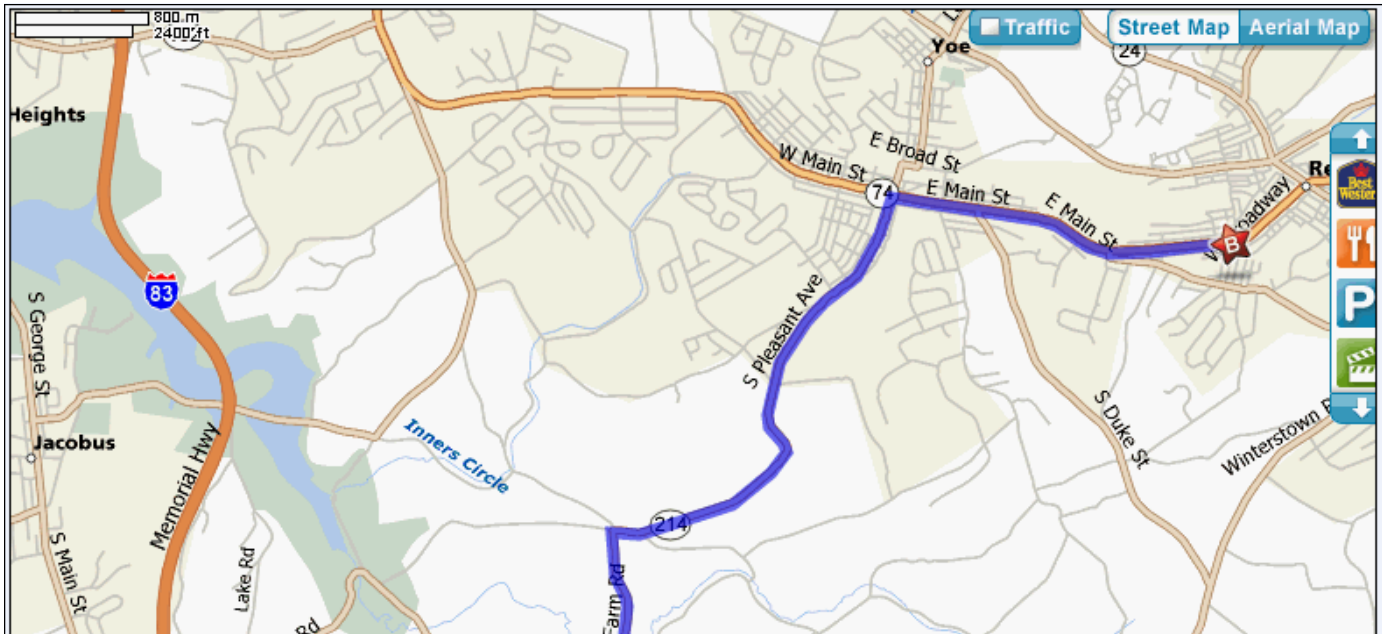
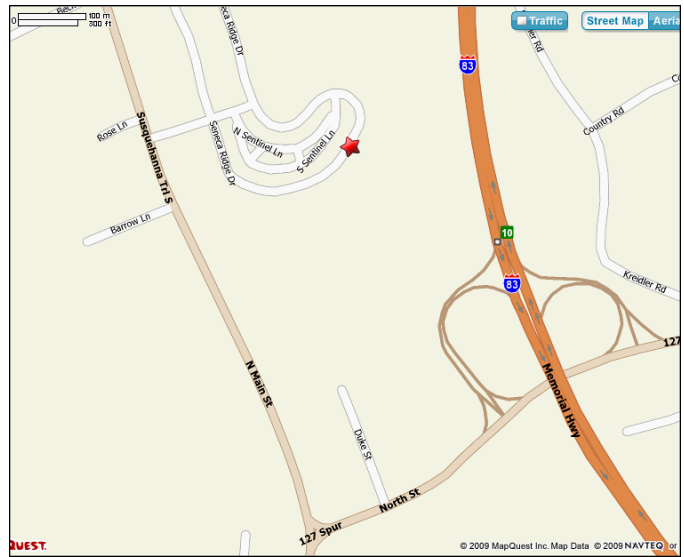
